businesses have been extremely helpful and welcoming to our students, but also share in our concern for student safety on these mornings. While most students are behaving very well, there have been a few students involved in risky behaviors. Some have earned community and school consequences for these behaviors since this school year started. Some students are arriving as early as 7:00 a.m. and staying for up to 2 hours at this location before their school day begins. Many are buying energy drinks and large amounts of candy. We would like to ask you to reconsider sending your child out to socialize with friends at the Nugget Market on these Wednesday mornings.

School Plan for Student Achievement

The Holmes staff and Site Council are updating the School Plan that follows state guidelines and focuses on increasing success for under-achieving students. The plan must be submitted to the district office in early January for Board of Education approval in late January. The process involves looking at a wide range of information including how our students are progressing, STAR Tests, grades, attendance, student survey responses, discipline records, etc. From this information, goals for student performance are written, and programs to support the goals are continued, modified, or implemented. Later, the effectiveness of these programs is evaluated and the plan will be revised for the following year. In addition, separate academic departments are writing goals about student performance. During collaboration mornings, the staff will be evaluating ways our school addresses these goals and will consider modifications and/or new programs.

Effective Communication: Email Guidelines

As a district, we are committed to communication between home and school that is essential to student success. Because of the ease and efficiency of email, we find that we are all managing an increasing number of messages every day. In the case of teachers, the time spent in responding to this email load can impact the teachers' ability to plan effective instruction and give prompt feedback to students about their work. A similar impact is felt throughout the community. To assist in the effective use of email, we offer these guidelines to staff, parents, and students:

Try to send the first email about an issue only to those directly involved rather than copying it to many others, a practice that increases everyone's message load.

- Shorter is better. You will receive the best and most focused answer when the message is as succinct as possible.
- Because of the speed of email, we all begin to expect equally speedy responses. Please allow up to two (2) working days for a response.
- Email messages can sometimes be misinterpreted. The phone or a conference is best when an issue may cause concern or prompt an emotional response.
- It is not always possible for teachers who are dealing with as many as 160 students per day to respond immediately, or to give daily reports about student behavior and progress. Before contacting a teacher for information that the student should have, please encourage your child to find the answers to questions by checking other school sources such as fellow students, bulletins, or teachers' websites.

New Student Information System (SIS)

As you all know, it is the long standing practice of the DJUSD to inform parents of student attendance in a predictable and detailed way on a daily basis. This has not been possible since the beginning of school due to the installation of a new student information system and new automated calling systems. Both implementation teams expected this to be a routine task but have encountered significant difficulties. Here are some things you can do to help:

- If you have been absent, you must hand in a note to the attendance office (the very next day you return to school) that has been signed by your parent/guardian indicating your name, date of absence, and reason for the absence OR have your parent/guardian call the attendance office with your name, date of absence, and reason for the absence. The attendance office telephone number is 757-5453 ext. 201.
- The PTA listserv regularly informs parents and guardians of events and issues at school by email. The daily bulletin is also available through listserv. The Holmes website (www.djusd.k12.ca.us/Holmes) posts the handbook and other important information about Holmes Junior High.

Parent Connect

Holmes Junior High Staff supports the DJUSD in their goal to provide secured online information access to parents. The Zangle System is a new tool for our district. Parent Connection is a web-based application that allows parents to access information about their child. Viewing assignments in Parent Connection is intended to serve as a support for parents to receive information about their child's academic history. It is not intended to replace parent communication with their child.

The Zangle System has a new tool for our students to use, called Student Connect. Student Connection is a web-based application like the Parent Connect that allows students to access information about themselves. Viewing assignments in Student Connection is intended to help support for students to receive information about their academic history. It is not intended to replace any other communication about your child.

Pin and passwords are needed to have access to both Parent Connect and Student Connect. These will be available at Holmes Junior High for all parents/guardians of Holmes Students; students must have a photo ID to receive their pin/passwords. We will be sending pins/passwords with the first quarter grades in the mail for all 7th graders and new students to Holmes Junior High. All returning 8th and 9th graders can use their code from last year. If you have forgotten your code, you may drop by the counseling office during lunch, before or after school to receive your pin/password.

Climate Change Assembly: What's Your DOT?

All students in all grades were treated to an assembly on climate change presented by the Alliance for Climate Education (ACE). You can see the trailer for this assembly at http://www.acespace.org. Select "Education" from the menu, then "The ACE Assembly", then "Watch Trailer."

As a follow-up to the assembly, students were encouraged to "Do One Thing" (DOT) for the environment, every day. One of the DOTs which was promoted by the presenter was to join the Holmes Green Team. The turnout for Green Team meetings has been fabulous during the past few weeks; 30-50 kids have attended the Green Team meetings in Ms. Quenon's room (C-25) at lunch. Students have formed 6-8 Action Teams comprised of 5-10 students to work on specific projects.

Teams are: promoting recycling by offering a "Go to the Head of the Lunch Line" ticket and getting more students to recycle, writing bulletin announcements, initiating food waste composting, creating presentations on recycling to be given to 7th and 8th grade classes, and having an art contest using recycled materials. Students are being encouraged to plan and complete all components of the action project themselves, but adults can be employed to help with some of the details. Contact Ms. Quenon if you're interested in helping with any of these projects or being a liaison between Green Team and Holmes' PTA.

Where will your kids be on upcoming furlough days and holidays?

With the addition of five extra days during the school year when DJUSD students will not be in class, parents who work away from home may be challenged to find something constructive for their kids to do, or to provide them with the supervision teens need.

Even Davis teens get into trouble without supervision, although many parents have no idea of the extent that kids are using alcohol and pot in particular when adults aren't around. You may think your child wouldn't use, but do you know what they really do when you aren't around on these days off?

There are several resources in Davis for students during times school is not in session. Some of these are listed below. In addition to having your teen participate in a structured alternative to staying alone unsupervised, you can do the following to minimize the risk of substance use when you are not around. Each idea requires the involvement of an adult in coming up with constructive alternatives to hanging out and possibly using.

Form an informal parent cooperative to share being at home during furlough days: Have parents take turns taking days off to host teen friends at one house during an early release, furlough day, or the Thanksgiving holidays.

Have your child enroll in doing volunteer work for the day(s) off: Examples include tutoring younger kids, food bank, working at the SPCA, migrant center, or the senior center. This contributes positively to kids' self esteem, helps the community, and develops competencies that are a deterrent to substance use.

Enroll your child in a structured activity:
There aren't enough of these options but
there are a few things in Davis that might work
for your family, including City of Davis Teen
Center programs at Harper and Holmes
during late start and articulation days, or the
UC Davis Craft Studio.

If your child already has too many activities and more structure is not an option when you are absent:

- Make a plan together for how your child will spend the time off;
- Leave your child with very clear expectations, such as not allowing other kids in the home when adults are not present;
- Know where s/he will spend his time;
- Get to know other parents and what they will allow if your child spends time with theirs.

Discussion Topic With Your Teen: Ask your teen what other kids do on these days off, and how s/he feels about their choices. Does s/he feel pressure to do the same things? Does s/he feel s/he is missing out or falling behind the social scene by not participating? Ask your teen if s/he needs any help from you in handling the situation.
